VERNON MEMORIAL LECTURES

TOWN PLANNING, 1935.

The Vernon Memorial Lectures in Town Planning will be delivered at the University of Sydney during Lent and Trinity Terms, 1935 (June to November inclusive).

The first lecture will be delivered on Wednesday, 12th June, at 7.45 p.m.

The Senate of the University have appointed Alfred J. Brown, Esq., A.R.I.B.A., A.M.P.T.I., as Vernon Memorial Lecturer, 1935. The lecturer is a recognized authority on the subject of Town Planning, and delivered the Vernon Memorial Lectures in 1931 and in 1933, the Course being given at two-yearly intervals. Mr. Brown is President of the Town and Country Planning Institute of New South Wales, and is a practising Architect and Town Planner. Attendance at the Course of Lectures is open to the general public.

Whilst the Course is primarily designed for students in such technical professions as Architecture, Surveying, and Engineering, there is much of interest and value to students of Local Government and of Public Health, Social Economists, Welfare Workers, and those generally interested in Civic Improvement.

The Fee for the Course is 10s., paid in advance. Tickets may be obtained from Angus & Robertson Ltd., 89 Castlereagh Street; Dymock's Book Arcade, 424 George Street; Moore's Book Shop, 60 King Street; New South Wales Bookstall Co., Ltd., Market and Castlereagh Streets; or by post on application to the Secretary, the Extension Board, the University. Tickets for single lectures, 1s. 6d. each, will be obtainable at the lecture room.

At the conclusion of the Course an examination will be held if desired by at least twenty students, and the Extension Board's Certificate will be given to those who wish to take the examination and who subsequently pass.


