Workshop activities and outcomes

In the first session of this workshop, we will provide a brief summary on a number of key projects discussed at previous ACSME RACI Chemistry Education Division Workshop. These include:

- 1. The development of a modular-based resource collection for undergraduate and postgraduate training in chemistry education research;
- 2. A revamp of the Chemistry Discipline Network website for better functionality and access;
- 3. Building a business case for the introduction of a chemistry education and/or discipline-based education Field of Research (FoR) code for use in ARC grant processes;
- 4. Actively seeking opportunities to host an international conference in chemistry education or discipline-based education more broadly;
- Actively seeking sponsorship opportunities to support RACI Chemistry Education Division awards/bursaries at related conferences and/or financial support for small research projects within our community.

The second session of this workshop will focus on Project 3 above (bolded). The aim of this session is to:

- Provide community feedback on the proposed approach and priorities for inclusion in the business case;
- Identify existing resources from the community that can be contributed or accessed;
- Discuss any missed considerations.
