ANNUAL REPORT

Gentlemen,—The Council have the honour to report concerning the operation of your Society for the Sessions, 1915-16, and 1916-17.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

At the last Annual General Meeting, held on 28th April, 1915, the Report and Balance Sheet for 1914-15 were read and adopted. The Council for Session 1915-16, with Mr. William Poole as President, were elected. The retiring President, Mr. W. H. Ledger, delivered his Presidential Address, and afterwards received a cordial vote of thanks for his services as President.

SPECIAL MEETING.

At a Special General Meeting, held on 5th April, 1916, it was decided to continue the then existing Council in office during Session 1916-17, to carry on the business of the Society by means of lectures, and to remit the fees of all members on active service.

ORDINARY MEETINGS.

In 1915, at five ordinary meetings, the business dealt with was:—

- 1. A Paper by Jack F. Hennessy, B.Sc., "Modern Architecture of America."
- 2. A discussion opened by C. T. Stephens, B.E., "Points of Interest in the Design of Reinforced Concrete Beams and Slabs in Bridges."
- 3. A Paper by R. W. Hawken, B.E., B.A., "The Deflection of a Beam and the Equation of Three Moments." A Paper by R. H. Downes, "The Stability of Retaining Walls."

- 4. A Paper by E. P. Taylor, B.E., "Carburettor Action."
- 5. A Paper by J. P. Tivey, B.E., B.A., "Notes on the Electrification of Railways, with Special Reference to the Direct Current System."

In 1916, at six Ordinary Meetings, the business was as follows:—

- 1. Lecture by the President, William Poole, B.E., "The Bulk Handling of Grain."
- 2. Lecture by F. A. Eastaugh, A.R.S.M., "The Microstructure of Metals, especially Steel."
- 3. Lecture by F. Danvers Power, "Sharp Practice in Engineering Undertakings."
- 4. Lecture by R. F. Irvine, Professor of Economics, "The Engineer and Industry."
- 5. Lecture by O. U. Vonwiller, Acting Professor of Physics, "The Practical Applications of Physical Research."
- 6. The Presidential Address of William Poole, B.E., A.M.I.C.E., "Engineering and Technical Education."

SPECIAL LECTURE.

To assist in the formation of an active Students' Section of the Society, the Rev. Thomas Tait was invited to deliver, in March, 1917, a lecture on "The Art of Public Speaking." Professor M. W. MacCallum kindly consented to preside at this lecture

EXCURSIONS.

There were excursions in 1915,

- 1. To inspect the works under progress on the Sydney Harbour.
- 2. To inspect the system of using sewage gas for power purposes at Parramatta.
- 3. To a demonstration of the three-rail system at Sydenham.

The Council desire to thank all who assisted them during the past two troublous years in carrying on the work of the Society. On the request of the Council, the Student members have formed a section to hold meetings controlled by themselves, at such times as they find convenient. Most of the Engineering Students have joined this section, and they have already held one successful meeting.

The Council regrets that, owing to the large number of members on active service, the funds available did not permit of the publication of a volume of the proceedings in 1916. The money now in hand is sufficient to provide one volume to cover the two sessions, 1915-16 and 1916-17.
