DEATH OF HIS LATE MAJESTY KING EDWARD VII.

On the motion of the President, Mr. Erskine, it was resolved that the members of the Engineering Association of New South Wales desire most respectfully to convey, through His Excellency the State Governor, their sincere regret at the news of the death of His Late Majesty King Edward VII., and to express their deepest sympathy with the members of the Royal Family on their bereavement, and further to assert their unaltered loyalty to the Throne, and to the present King, His Majesty George V., and that this resolution be forwarded to His Excellency the State Governor, under the seal of the Association.
