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#### FOREWORD

The 1996 annual conference of the Association for the Study of Australian Literature was held in Brisbane from 6 - 11 July. The following is a record of the formal proceedings of the conference, published by ASAL for its members.

Our title for this collection, "Current Tensions", is a phrase taken from the keynote address by Simon During, which examined the historical and current position of literary studies. There was no overall theme stipulated for this year's conference, resulting in a wide-ranging number of papers, which included a diversity of critical and theoretical perspectives. Almost all of the papers given during the conference have been included in this collection.

The conference included readings by David Foster, Amanda Lohrey, Venero Armanno, Rosie Scott, Joanne Burns, Laurie Duggan, Lisa Bellear and Jay Verney. There were panel sessions with a number of these writers, as well as a day trip to the rainforest at Binna Burra, book launches, a parody night and the conference dinner.

The papers are arranged here in the order in which they were given. Editing has been kept to a minimum, and papers remain close to the form in which they were delivered.
