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- JUDITH BEVERIDGE lives in Sydney and has been one of Australia's leading poets since her first book of poems, *The Domesticity of Giraffes* (1987), won her the Dame Mary Gilmore Award, the NSW Premier's Award and the Victorian Premier's Award.
- WILLIAM CHRISTIE is a senior lecturer in English at the University of Sydney and co-editor of Literature and Aesthetics.
- CHRIS CONTI holds a BA and PhD from the University of Sydney and teaches English and media studies at the University of Western Sydney and Macquarie University.
- R. A. GOODRICH teaches in the School of Literary and Communications Studies at Deakin Unversity (Melbourne) and is coconvenor of a national series of performance based arts conferences entitled Double Dialogues, as well as co-editor of its forthcoming on-line journal.
- ROBERT GRAY is one of Australia's leading poets. Author of several volumes and retrospective collections since his Saltwater Creek was published in 1975, he has received (amongst numerous other awards and prizes and fellowships from the Literature Board) the NSW Premier's Award, the Adelaide Festival Award for Literature, the Victorian Premier's Award, the Grace Leven Poetry Prize, and the Patrick White Award.
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- PATRICK HUTCHINGS is a former reader in Philosophy at Deakin University and the University of Western Australia and is currently an associate editor of the philosophical journal Sophia.
