ANNUAL MEETING.

At the Annual General Meeting, held on April 20th, 1910, the retiring President (Mr. H. S. Mort) delivered an address on "Ancient Engineering," and welcomed the incoming President, Mr. W. E. Cook, to the chair.

ATTENDANCE.

During the past Session six Ordinary General Meetings were held, at which the average attendance was 53, as against 60 the year before, thus showing a slight decrease. This decrease is probably due to the postponement of Mr. Debenham's paper owing to the death of His Majesty King Edward VII., and to the unfortunate clashing of the date of Mr. Cardew's paper with that of another University Function.

We beg to place on record our appreciation of the services rendered to the Society by Prof. A. J. Gibson, and to congratulate him on his appointment to the Chair of Engineering at the Queensland University.

We submit herewith the Hon. Treasurer's Report on the financial position of the Society:—

Gentlemen,—

I have the honour to present to you the Financial Report and Balance-sheet for the year ending 31st March, 1911.

During the year 62 members and 64 student members, 126 in all, have paid subscriptions. This falls below the record created last Session, but is greater than any other previous year.

It is disappointing to notice that this falling off is entirely amongst the Members, due possibly to a reaction after last year's record.

The Statement of cash in hand and liabilities shows that the Society can congratulate itself on a credit balance on the year's working.

This happy state of affairs is due entirely to the energy of the retiring Treasurer, Mr. H. M. Larkins, who was compelled to resign at the end of December, 1910, after holding office for $2\frac{1}{2}$ years, owing to his departure from Sydney.

I take this opportunity of thanking the Assistant Treasurer, Mr. T. Wilkins, for his services during the past year.
